

The Windsor Service Area has a population of 8,070 according to the 2000 Census of Population and Housing. The area is 51 percent female and 49 percent male. About a fifth of the population is 60 and older (19.9 percent compared to 17.6 percent statewide and 21.2 percent in the 13-county Care Connection Area).

The area's seniors age 55 and older are predominantly Caucasian (98.1%). The area also has 73 seniors of other races. The area is also home to 82 Multiracial seniors age 55 and older and 28 Hispanics age 55 and older.

Over half (60.4%) of the households with householder age 65 and older reside in family households. This is just slightly under the state percentage of 61.3 percent statewide. The Windsor Service Area has a slightly higher proportion of persons 65 and older living alone – 33.7 percent compared to 30.2 percent both statewide and for the 13-county Care Connection Area.

The Windsor Service Area has a much higher rate of seniors living below poverty than the state overall. The poverty rate of persons 65 and older is 18.3 percent compared to 9.9 percent statewide and 11.7 percent in the 13-county area. Likewise, for persons 75 and older the rate is 25.8 percent compared to 12.3 percent statewide and 14.7 percent in the overall Care Connection Area.

There are 3,126 occupied housing units in this service area in which the occupant is age 55 and older. About 79 percent of homes are owner-occupied compared to 70.2 percent statewide and 73 percent in the 13-county area overall. According to the 2000 Census, much of the housing stock in this service area was built before 1940 (21.4%). Only 9 percent of housing stock was built between 1995 and 2000.

Disabilities are tallied per disability, i.e., a person with multiple disabilities would be counted multiple times – one for each disability. The ratio of disabilities per population age 65 and older is 94.8 in the Windsor Area compared to 78.5 statewide. The most common disability tallied was physical disability (34.8%) followed by “go-outside-home” disability (19.3%), sensory disability (17.1%), mental disability (13.5%), and self-care disability (10.1%).

Just over half of persons age 65 and older in this area reported being married-couples in the 2000 Census (52.4%). Another 35.2 percent reported being widowed. As would be expected, the most likely to report being widowed are those age 85 and older (63.7%). This is just above the state rate of 63.2 percent and the 13-county area rate of 60.5 percent.

The Windsor Service Area had a slightly higher percentage of persons 65 and older who had completed high school (37.9%) than the state (33.9%) but less than the 13-county area (38.3%). Two percent of Windsor area seniors reported having a Bachelor's Degree according to the 2000 Census.
